

Current and former employees of UPMC entities whose personally identifying information was potentially impacted by the data breach announced by UPMC in February 2014 may be eligible for a payment from a class action settlement.

A Settlement has been reached with UPMC in a class action lawsuit about a data security incident (“the 2014 Data Breach”) disclosed in February 2014 where UPMC’s computer network system was the target of an external criminal cyberattack. The lawsuit asserted claims for negligence against UPMC relating to the 2014 Data Breach. UPMC denies that it was negligent or engaged in any wrongdoing.

WHO IS INCLUDED? You received this Notice because UPMC’s records show you are a likely member of the Settlement Class. The Settlement Class includes current and former employees of UPMC entities whose personal information was contained in or on the UPMC computer system and was potentially accessed, stolen, or compromised as a result of the data breach announced in February 2014.

SETTLEMENT BENEFITS. UPMC will create a fund of \$1,679,000. This fund will be used for automatic payments of approximately \$10–\$20 to each class member. In addition, the following types of reimbursements of specific costs may be paid to those who submit valid claims:

1) Reimbursement of up to \$5,000 for documented out-of-pocket fraud losses attributable to actual identity fraud and/or identity theft as a result of the 2014 Data Breach; and 2) Reimbursement of up to \$250 for fraud-related inconveniences that resulted from the 2014 Data Breach. The payment amounts depend on available funds and may be reduced pro rata. Fraud-related inconvenience claims may not be made at all if insufficient funds remain. The fund will also be used to pay administration costs in excess of \$200,000. Apart from the fund, UPMC has agreed to pay up to \$750,000 in attorneys’ fees and expenses and up to \$21,000 total in Service Awards to seven named class representatives.

CLAIM FORM. You must file a Claim Form and supporting documentation to receive more than the \$10–\$20 automatic payment. You can file a claim online at www.UPMCDittmanSettlement.com, download a Claim Form on the website and mail it, or you may call 1-855-535-1794 and ask that a Claim Form be mailed to you. The Claims Deadline is **November 19, 2021**.

OTHER OPTIONS. If you do not want to be legally bound by the Settlement, you must exclude yourself by **November 19, 2021**. If you stay in the Settlement, you may object to it by **November 19, 2021**. A more detailed notice is available to explain how to exclude yourself or object. Please visit the website or call the toll-free number for a copy of the detailed notice. **On December 29, 2021**, the Court will hold a hearing on whether to approve the Settlement, Class Counsel’s request for attorneys’ fees and expenses, and Service Awards for the Representative Plaintiffs. You or your own lawyer, if you have one, may ask to appear and speak at the hearing at your own cost, but you do not have to.
